Merrick, Papsin Run To Roxbury Winners Circle

ROXBURY -- The male season champion for the last three years and the female winner of the most recent race in the weekly series took the laurels in Roxbury over a 3.7-mile run.

Ken Merrick of New Fairfield was the overall winner with a 23-minute, 28-second clocking – 6:21 per mile – Saturday, March 28, on the layout, which included a trek down the long incline on Ranney Hill Road and up the steep hill on Chalybes Road.

Ryan Ripp was second in 25:15.

Leah Papsin, a native of Morris and former University of Connecticut-Storrs soccer player, led the female division and placed fifth overall in 25:37. She also had prevailed among the females March 14 over a 2.4-mile loop.

The series will continue Saturday, April 4, at 8:30 a.m. with a jaunt over the same 3.7-mile course, except in the opposite direction. There will be no entry fee.

The 25th annual Larry Kershnar MidSpring Challenge will be held Saturday, May 2, at 8:30 a.m. The \$5 entry fee can be paid that morning from 7 to 8:20, with proceeds going to the Roxbury park improvement fund.

The top overall male and top overall female finisher will each receive a \$10 gift certificate to an area running store.

The event is named after a former head director of the series.

The races, which are sanctioned by the Roxbury Recreation Commission, start and finish near the Everett Hurlburt Community Park at 18 Apple Lane.
