Sheldon, Masopust Mark Victories On Moosehorn

ROXBURY – Jeff Sheldon and Alison Masopust wore the Bullwinkle antlers after winning their respective divisions in the second annual Moosehorn Run at the weekly Roxbury Road Runners Club series.

Sheldon, 37, of Southbury was clocked 1-hour, 8-minutes and 28-seconds – a 6:59-per-mile pace – Saturday, June 3, on the challenging course, which includes a trip up the hills on Moosehorn Road. The former two-time season champion in the weekly races posted his fourth win of the season.

Former season champion Chris Deming, 50, of Danbury placed second in 1:10.29.

Masopust, 33, of Morris captured the women's division and was sixth overall in 1:14.07. She has captured the female title in 11 of the 14 races this campaign.

The series will resume on Saturday, June 10, at 8:30 a.m. with a 3.9-mile jaunt that will include a trip along a jeep trail.

Runners can enter through the \$50 season membership or a \$5 weekly waiver fee.

The Bill Burley MidSummer Championship will be held on Saturday, July 8, at 8:30 a.m. The race will be organized at the Minor Memorial Library on South Street with the start at finish at the nearby Booth Free Elementary School.

There will be a \$5 entry fee that can be paid that morning from 7 to 8:20. Proceeds will go to the library. The run is named after the founder of the series who also served as the head director through the first three years – 1977-1979. Burley, a former Roxbury resident

who was an elementary school principal in New Milford, plans to attend the run.

The races, which are sanctioned by the Roxbury Recreation Commission, usually start and finish near the Everett Hurlburt Community Park at 18 Apple Lane.
