Lesch, 50, copped the female title and was 14th overall in 59:43.

Runners can enter through the \$50 season membership or the \$5 weekly waiver.

There will be a \$5 entry fee that can be paid that morning from 7 to 8:20 proceeds will go to the series' T-shirt/grants campaign.

The Roxbury Thanksgiving Charity Race will be held on Thursday, November 23, at 9 a.m. along a 3.1-mile course.

There will be a \$10 entry fee that can be paid that morning from 7 to 8:50. Proceeds will be directed to Hurricane Harvey relief.
