Quigley, Masopust Post Victories Over Challenging Mallory Road Course

ROXBURY – After placing second overall a week earlier, Sam Quigley posted his first victory at the Roxbury Road Races Club series and Alison Masopust ran to her 12th triumph of the season in the women's division.

Quigley, 15, of Roxbury, who was the runner-up in the 3.0-mile Bill Burley MidSummer/Roxbury Land Trust Championship race a week earlier, covered a 7.25-mile route, which included a climb up the long, steep hills on Mallory Road, in 50-minutes, 13-seconds – a 6:56-permile pace.

Chris Deming, 51, of Danbury was second in the Saturday, July 21, event with a clocking of 52:02.

Masopust topped the female standings and was eighth overall with a time of 58:03.

There will be no race on Saturday, July 28 – the date of the New Milford Village Fair Day races. The series will resume on Saturday, August 4, at 8:30 a.m. with an 8.2-mile jaunt that will include a trip along part of Judd's Bridge Road.

The races, which are sanctioned by the Roxbury Recreation Commission, usually start and finish near the Everett Hurlburt Community Park at 18 Apple Lane.
