Green Machine Makes Strides Over Roxbury Roads

ROXBURY – Two runners from the Green Wave scored victories over a rolling 4.3-mile course as the Roxbury Road Races Club series awarded its grants for the 2018 season.

Eli Nahom, 17, from the New Milford High School Green Wave sped to a photofinish victory in 25-minutes, 19-seconds – a 5:53-per-mile pace.

Sean Parker, 19, a former Shepaug Valley High School harrier, was second in 25:20.

Another New Milford High School runner, Brooke Marabito, 16, was the female champion and placed 16th overall in the field of 66 finishers. She was clocked in 31:38

There were a number of runners from New Milford High School and from the Oxford High School Wolverines. Following the race, there was a brief ceremony in which the 2018 grants from the series were presented to the two schools.

Oxford received \$300 toward the purchase of a mat for their outdoor high jump area and New Milford got \$300 for the purchase of reflective athletic clothing.

The weekly series will continue on Saturday, April 7, at 8:30 a.m. with a 3.6-mile run that will include a trip along a jeep trail.

Runners can enter through the \$25 season membership or the \$2 weekly waiver. Youth runners can participate for free.

The races, which are sanctioned by the Roxbury Recreation Commission, start and finish near the Everett Hurlburt Community Park at 18 Apple Lane.
