ROXBURY – Chris Deming and Lauren Contorno delivered performances worthy of a shower of confetti by winning their respective divisions over a demanding 7.2-mile loop at the Roxbury Road Races Club series.

Deming, 51, of Danbury earned the silver trophy platter by finishing the course, which included a trip up the steep inclines on Painter Hill Road, in 51-minutes, 39-seconds – a 7:10-per-mile pace. He is a former season champion in the series.

Nate Mahrer, 46, who lives in New York City and Roxbury, took second in the Saturday, September 29, event with a time of 55:09.

Contorno, 53, was the first female and 11th overall with a 1:05.46 clocking.

The weekly series will resume on Saturday, October 6, at 8:30 a.m. with a 4.4-mile run that will include a jaunt up the hill on Chalybes Road and down the long incline on Hemlock Road.

The course was designed by long-time runner Dave Harvey.

Runners can enter through the \$25 season membership or the \$2 weekly waiver. Youth competitors can participate for free by completing the weekly waiver.

The Roxbury Marathon/Half Marathon are slated for Saturday, November 10, at 8:30 a.m. Registration is available at www.roxburyraces.net.

The second annual Roxbury Thanksgiving Charity Race will be held on Thursday, November 22, at 9 a.m. There will be no race-day registration. Runners can enter for \$12.50 via the Ultra Sign-up link at www.roxburyraces.net.
