Kuenzle Sets Course Record In Roxbury Spring Winds

ROXBURY – Jack Kuenzle, 23, of Roxbury overcame stiff spring winds to gallop to a course record on a 4.2-mile loop at the Roxbury Road Races Club series.

Kuenzle, whose father ran in some of the weekly races in the early 2000s, covered the route, which included a trip up the incline on Ranney Hill Road, on Saturday, May 11, in 24-minutes – a 5:43-per-mile pace.

Alison Masopust, 35, of Morris was the first female and placed second overall in 26:23.

The series will resume on Saturday, May 18, at 8:30 a.m. with a 7.25-mile run that will include a trip along the hills on Mallory Road.

The Roxbury Mile I is scheduled for Saturday, May 25, at 8:30 a.m., extending from near the end of Apple Lane to the end of the parking lot at the Booth Free School.

Runners can enter the weekly races through the \$25 season membership or the \$2 weekly waiver. Youth runners can compete for free by completing the weekly waiver.

The races, which are sanctioned by the Roxbury Recreation Commission, usually start and finish near the Everett Hurlburt Community Park at 18 Apple Lane.
