

Dennen, Levy Deserving Of Red, White And Blue Bunting At Roxbury Mile I

ROXBURY – Pat Dennen and Alana Levy celebrated the holiday weekend with easy triumphs in their respective categories at the Roxbury Mile I, which, as usual, attracted contestants of all ages.

Dennen, 39, a 1998 Newtown High School graduate who now lives in Middlebury, covered the loop of alternating mild to moderate up-hills and downhills in five minutes, five seconds at the Roxbury Road Races Club series.

Mike Hall holds the course record of 4:42.

Levy, 30, who hails from Chappaqua, N.Y. captured the women's division and was second overall in 5:27.

There were 50 finishers, one of them just five years of age as some families participated in the run, which went from near the end of Apple Lane to the end of the parking lot at the Booth Free School.

The weekly series will resume on Saturday, June 1, at 8:30 a.m. with the 9.9-mile Moosehorn course.

Runners can enter through the \$25 season membership or the \$2 weekly waiver.

Youth runners can compete for free by completing the form for the weekly waiver.

The races, which are sanctioned by the Roxbury Recreation Commission, typically start and finish near the Everett Hurlburt Community Park at 18 Apple Lane.
