Andrejczyk Captures 3.7-mile Jaunt

ROXBURY – Longtime series veteran Mark Andrejczyk scored his first victory of the 2025 campaign at the weekly Roxbury Road Runners Club series over a challenging course that included a trip up the steep incline on Ranney Hill Road.

Andrejczyk, 52, of Shelton was timed on the 3.7-mile loop in 24-minutes, 48 - seconds — a 6:42-per-mile pace. He outran Jeff Lipchus, 42, of the Sandy Hook section of Newtown, who placed second in the Saturday, September 20, race with a clocking of 25:06. Lipchus had been the winner in the previous two races.

Rina McNamara won the women's division and placed fourth overall in 27:31 She won the women's season championship in 2024.

The series will on Saturday, September 27, at 8:30 a.m. with an 11-mile race that will include a trip up the steep incline on Botsford Hill.

Runners can compete through the \$30 season membership. They also can participate by completing the weekly waiver form and paying a \$5 fee. Youth entrants and current and former members of t he military and current and former first responders can run for free after completing the weekly waiver form.

The Roxbury Fall Classic is slated for Saturday, November 8. Pre-registration for the half-marathon, marathon and 50-kilomer races is available through UltraSignUp.

The Roxbury Thanksgiving Day Charity Race will be run over 3.1 miles on Saturday, November 27, at 9 a.m. Proceeds will go to the Roxbury Ambulance Association and the Roxbury Scholarship Foundation.

Pre-registration is available via UltraSignUp. The fee is \$10 along with a \$3.12 service charge. Race-day registration will be available at \$15 per runner on November 27 from 7:30 a.m. to 8:50 a.m.

The races, which are sanctioned by the Roxbury Recreation Commission, start and finish near the Everett B. Hurlburt Community Park at 18 Apple Lane.
